Thank you to all our NCA families that provided feedback through the recent survey. We had about 60% of our families respond. This is the final installment of survey results.

- Our families appreciate the opportunity get to know other NCA families through our various events. Muffins with Mom, Donuts with Dad, athletic events, and field trips are the top events where our families connect.
- Our staggered dismissal process received very positive comments. We will continue this practice next year.
- Our teachers and staff were listed as the most significant factor which exceeds expectations.
